## Redcliffe Career Expo at Grace College

Redcliffe's businesses will come together with Queensland's top training and tertiary organisations to showcase the multitude of job options open to local students when they finish school.

Aimed at the Peninsula's year 10, 11, & 12 students, their parents and the unemployed, the Careers and Business Exhibition has been designed in such a way that all concerned can get an insider's view to a range of career options by talking directly to people already working in the field.

President of the Redcliffe Chamber of Commerce, Don Gemmill, said "By bringing local businesses and a range of trainers together, students and parents can talk directly to employers and educators to find out the sort of training and skills needed to work in a particular field."

The Chamber of Commerce believes that this can help make the decision clearer about which path to take after finishing school, especially when students can then check out both training and work options at the same time.

On hand at the Expo will be North Point TAFE, Universities, Queensland Apprenticeship Services, Defence Forces, State Emergency Service, Queensland Police and local employment agencies, along with local

business representatives.

The local business theme will be focused on the advantages of small business, and self-employment. The Exhibition can also help local employers access trained staff through the various employment agencies as well as training institutes.

The Careers and Business Exhibition will be held in the Multi - Purpose Centre, Grace Lutheran College, Anzac Avenue, Rothwell on Tuesday, 9th August 2005, with sessions from 9.30am to 3.00pm and 5.30pm to 8pm.

**Former Mayor, Barry Bolton, disappointed in "random" selection**

In a letter to the Redcliffe City Council former Redcliffe Mayor Barry Bolton OAM expressed his disappointment at being excluded from the guest list when Governor of Queensland, Her Excellency Quentin Bryce AC visited the city in May this year.

"As a former Mayor of the City of Redcliffe, I am surprised and somewhat disappointed that I did not receive an invitation to attend the morning tea," said Mr Bolton.

Mr Bolton said he was informed that invitations were made to people involved in local organizations and guests were selected on a "random" basis, but, on analysing the list, disagrees with the comment and believes the selection was

politically motivated. As a Life Member of the Redcliffe Show Society, the Redcliffe Leagues Club, the Lions Club of Redcliffe City; Past District Governor of Lions Clubs International, President of the Redcliffe Branch of National Seniors, Patron of the Redcliffe Orchid Society and a recipient of an OAM in the Queen's Honours in 1996, Mr Bolton felt he more than qualified for selection.

"After viewing the guest list, I find that your so-called "random" method of selection destroys the concept of "mathematical probability" because of certain invitees with a common interest," he said in a letter to Redcliffe CEO Bob Holmes.
